Colleagues,

We hope that this finds each of you doing well. We're about a month out from the annual CHERC Conference, which will be held this year on Sunday and Monday, March 9 and 10 at the Villanova Conference Center, adjacent to the Villanova University campus in suburban Philadelphia – same location as last year.

This year we will be wrestling with the topic of how we go about studying spirituality on our campuses. All of our institutions, by their very nature, have the spiritual development of our students as part of our missions. Likewise, many of us have a sincere desire to help address the spiritual needs of our broader community members, as well. However, it is often difficult to determine what impact we may be having in this area. At this year's conference we hope to begin to discuss, as a group, how one might go about exploring the impact of our work in promoting spiritual development. Obviously, we're looking forward to a lively discussion of this topic. And, certainly we're open to anything anyone may have to share in this realm and to suggestions folks may have about others whom we should invite to join us in this dialogue.

At this point, we're hoping that we'll be joined for our time together by Dr. Elizabeth J. Tisdell, Associate Professor of Adult Education at Penn State University – Harrisburg, author of "Exploring Spirituality and Culture in Adult and Higher Education" (Jossey-Bass, 2003) and a host of other papers and publications addressing this topic.

As usual, we'll also have our annual business meeting, roundtable discussions and informal information sharing. Fr. Peter M. Donohue, O.S.A., who is now in his second year as President of Villanova, has agreed to speak to the group. You may remember that Father Peter welcomed us to Villanova last year. Father will talk about the role he sees for IR, planning, etc. at Catholic institutions moving forward from his perspective as a President. He'll specifically focus on how he has used a Campus Community Climate Survey, which he commissioned from Villanova's Office of Planning, Training and Institutional Research as one of his first acts as President, to better understand the University and promote organizational change.

We look forward to seeing you next month at Villanova. Please come ready to share and help us wrestle with this important topic. Information about the conference is attached. A full agenda will be sent as soon as it is finalized. In the meantime, please feel free to register for the conference and make your room reservation. Remember that outside of the cost of overnight rooms, the conference fee is inclusive of all meals and materials. General Transportation Information

The Villanova Conference Center is located a mile from the Villanova University campus. Villanova is located a few miles outside of Philadelphia. The University is easily accessible by plane, train or automobile. The Philadelphia International Airport is approximately 25 minutes away by car and the Villanova train station is located right on campus. The University is served by the Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority (SEPTA) R5 Paoli/Thorndale line out of 30th Street Station, which also serves as Philadelphia's Amtrak hub. A train is available from the airport into the 30th Street, where you can transfer to the R5 line. SEPTA schedules are available at www.septa.org. Taxi and shuttle service is available from the airport to the Conference Center. We can arrange transportation from the Villanova train station to the Conference Center, if requested.
